

#### Director's Note

In a small farm community during the depression, water and faith are in short supply. A charismatic but back-sliding preacher drifts into town and meets a gentle but misunderstood boy with the gift of divining or water-witching. The two outcasts find a common bond and help each other divine for truth, faith and hope. The townspeople, however, demand the preacher return to a way of life he no longer believes in and it drives both men to a crisis of trust. The characters are simple but good people searching for hope and something to believe in.

In a true community, the joys and pains of the individual are shared and shouldered by all, and it is this sense of community that binds these people together, allowing them to persevere with determination, hope and good humor. Possessed of a great respect for the land and those they share it with, the people of Zion still believe in common courtesy, and the value of a handshake. The playwright, Jim Leonard Jr., said it best, "These are good and simple people, and they have nothing but the best of intentions."

Our set design for this play is fairly simple and for good reason. This is a play about the characters and the events that mold their lives, rather than a specific setting. We ask that you use your imaginations to envision farmlands, homes, businesses, and riverbanks of Zion, Indiana where our story will take place.

The ending of the play is intentionally ambiguous. It asks the audience to decide for themselves as to what exactly happened on that tragic morning down by the river. Whose fault was it? Or was it really anyone's fault...was it more of a dealing of fate? No clear answers are given, but one thing is for sure. The people of Zion will forever be changed and affected.
